

Volunteer Directions for Japanese American National Museum Field Trips

Thanks to a grant from the California State Library to educate Californians about their civil liberties, PUSD high school students will tour the Japanese American National Museum in LA's Little Tokyo to learn more about the history of Japanese Americans and their internment during WWII.

The museum requires 1 chaperone per 10 students. Each day a total of approximately 75 - 100 students, led by PUSD teachers in smaller groups, will tour the museum. Volunteers will help teachers keep their classroom groups together as they make their way through the exhibits.

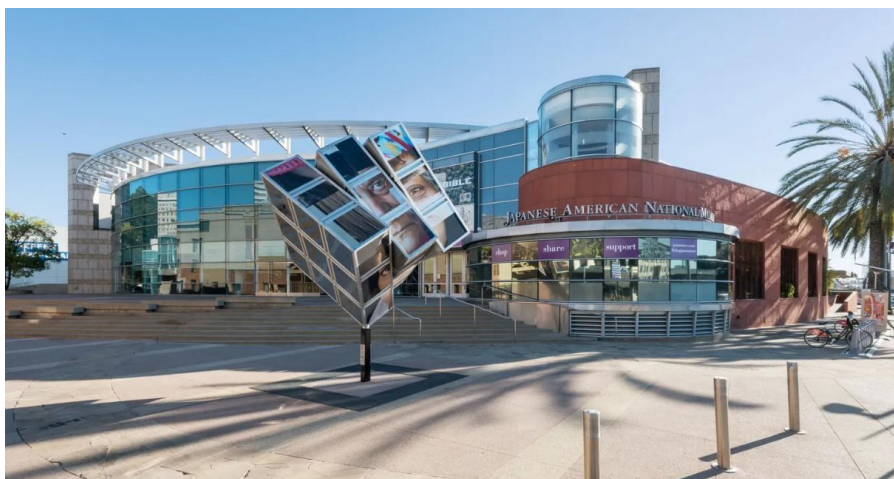
