



Agape – Letters Guide

- No photocopies or computer printed letters.
- PLAIN PAPER, can be decorated. No glitter or stickers. No seals. Nothing glued on. NO cardstock or notecards.
- Best to use “Dear Brother in Christ,” as the opening line.
- Short, positive, uplifting, and loving. No preaching or proselytizing. No reference to sentences or punishment.



Agape – Letters Guide

- Sign the letters with closing of your choice. Best to end with “Your Brother in Christ” or “Your Sister in Christ”. First name, Last name, Home address, Phone number or e-mail address should NEVER be included.
- No envelopes. Fold letter in thirds. No tape or staples. Agape/service team will put the letter in bags to distribute.
- You may include a small act of service or sacrifice. Keep it very simple. An extra prayer, a small good work, an extra effort, etc.
