

Restorative Justice Circles: Teen Court

Classroom disruptions can prevent students from learning. Suspensions and expulsions are also harmful to a student's learning.



Once a student completes the sanctions, any charge they were facing goes away; they have a clean slate. With this second chance comes the opportunity to begin again.

Peer Jury Panels and Peer Accountability Circles, both Restorative Justice (RJ) Practices, provide accountability for those students causing harm by their actions. Additionally, they are obligated to repair the harm they caused through sanctions assigned by the peer jury or other actions identified within the circle process.
