### Build Hygiene Kits

Since 1975, Pathways of Hope has led a community effort to provide access to food, shelter, and housing to those experiencing hunger and homelessness in North Orange County. The HUB of Hope is our walk-in community resource center in Fullerton where those in need can access our food pantry program as well as an array of housing services.

You can directly help the people we serve by building care kits that will be given out at The HUB resource center. This project is great for families, church groups, coworkers or any other group that wants to come together and do some good in our community.

#### HERE'S HOW:

- 1. COLLECT ITEMS:** We encourage you to get creative with the items you choose! Just keep in mind these kits may be carried around everywhere and so shouldn't be too heavy. Here's a list of suggested items to help get you started:

- Water bottle
- Socks & beanie caps
- Tuna (pop top canned meat) and crackers
- Granola bar or cereal bar
- Fruit snack or applesauce cup
- Crackers with peanut butter or cheese
- Gift certificate to fast food
- Hand wipes and hand sanitizer
- Lotion
- Band Aids
- Chapstick
- Sunscreen, sun hat, sunglasses
- Comb or small brush

- Shampoo/conditioner
- Pack of facial tissues
- Maxi pads/tampons

- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Can opener
- Mints, cough drops or gum

**2. CREATE BAGS:** Now you're ready to assemble! Gather all the items you've collected and put them in a large Ziploc, cinch sack or small backpack. Invite your friends, family or colleagues to help you out!

**3. DROP OFF:** Once all the care kits have been assembled, you're ready to drop them off!

- **LOCATION:** 611 S. Ford Ave., Fullerton, CA 92832

- **HOURS:** Tuesday thru Friday between 9:30am – 11:30am are preferred. If you arrive outside these hours, we'll be serving the community, and you may have to wait until our participants have been served.

- **PARKING:** You can park directly in front of the HUB and knock on the blue door on the far left of the building. A volunteer or staff member will be there to collect your items and, if requested, give you an in-kind donation receipt for your records. Additional parking may be available to the rear of the HUB.
